ASSESSMENT OF NEEDS

Rapid advances in HIV disease management require the ongoing attention of practitioners involved in HIV medicine. This course will address the implications of new information on strategies for clinical management. Information will be presented through a mix of didactic lectures and clinically relevant cases developed by an expert faculty of HIV/AIDS clinicians and researchers.

Some medical specialty societies and some state licensing boards may require that members earn a certain number of HIV/AIDS *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™*. This course may contribute toward those requirements.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to:

- Design antiretroviral strategies that consider current data on:
 - HIV pathogenesis as it impacts clinical treatment strategies
 - Cardiovascular risk of HIV and its therapies
 - Managing treatment failure
 - Antiretroviral drug resistance and the use of newer agents
- Describe the incidence of non-AIDS-defining cancers in HIV
- Formulate appropriate management strategies for HIV and hepatitis C virus coinfection
- Manage methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* (MRSA) in HIV-infected patients
- Formulate appropriate management strategies for substance users

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Information regarding financial relationships with commercial companies that have interests in the content discussed, is obtained from all parties with control over the activity content (ie, co-chairs, faculty, and IAS-USA staff), and any conflicts of interest of those parties are resolved prior to the activity being delivered. WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This course is designed for physicians who are actively involved in the medical care of people with HIV/AIDS, specifically those who:

- Have a solid, working knowledge of HIV disease management
- Provide comprehensive or specialty care for patients with HIV/AIDS
- Are currently active in HIV/AIDS research

This course is also relevant for nonphysician practitioners involved in HIV/AIDS patient care, including nurse practitioners and other nursing professionals, physician assistants, pharmacists, and others.

Representatives and employees of commercial companies (pharmaceutical, diagnostic, medical products, advertising, insurance, investment, communications firms, etc) must contact the International AIDS Society–USA regarding registration procedures.

CME ACCREDITATION

The International AIDS Society–USA is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education to sponsor continuing medical education for physicians.

CREDIT DESIGNATION

The International AIDS Society–USA designates this educational activity for a maximum of 6.5 *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™*. Physicians should only claim credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

AMERICAN ACADEMY OF FAMILY PHYSICIANS CREDIT

NURSING CONTACT HOURS CREDIT DESIGNATION

Commercial support of CME has been widely debated in recent years. Since 1991, the IAS–USA has used a model of pooling commercial support from companies with competing products for industry-supported CME activities, which, along with other firewalls, has allowed the organization to provide high-quality, and truly independent professional education.

Some individuals and institutions are forming their own guidelines with regard to the interactions between health care providers and industry, including proposals to eliminate all commercial support from certified CME efforts. Given this environment, the IAS–USA is now offering 2 levels of registration fees for course attendees (excluding the FED fee noted below).

The first is the subsidized fee, \$50, which is made possible by generous pooled commercial support. The second registration fee, \$573, is the full cost of attendance. The option to pay the full cost of attendance is intended for practitioners who wish to receive no financial support from commercial sources for their attendance at CME activities. This unsubsidized fee represents the actual cost per attendee, including costs for meeting room rental; print and production; faculty travel; audiovisual equipment; speaker honoraria; food and beverage service; and administration. These costs are lower than usual because of the deep discounts the IAS–USA can negotiate as a not-for-profit entity. Nevertheless, they are considerably more expensive to the participant than the subsidized fare.

Federal Employee Discount (FED): If you qualify for the FED discount, the registration fee is \$40. To qualify, you must be employed by the United States Federal Government. This unsubsidized fee satisfies guidelines between federal employee health care providers and commercial industry.
